Drill stands

- · The stand is for drilling in roofs, walls and floors.
- The baseplate is made of aluminium making it very light in weight.
- The column can be tilted 0-60°.
- The stand is fitted with a clamp.
- The feed lever can be used to loosen and tighten the clamp, adjust the adjustment bolts in the baseplate.




- The stand is for drilling in roofs, walls and floors.
- The baseplate is made of aluminium making it very light in weight. It has an inbuilt vacuum plate.
- The column can be tilted O-45°. The drill stand is equipped with a quick connection plate for the drill motor.
- The wheel kit is removable.
- Feed lever can be used to adjust base plate leveling screws and quick connection plate screw.

MACHINE'S SAFETY EQUIPMENT

General



W ARNING! Never use a machine with faulty safety equipment. The machine's safety equipment must be checked and maintained as described in this section. If your machine fails any of these checks contact your service agent to get it repaired.

This section describes the machine's safety equipment, its purpose, and how checks and maintenance should be carried out to ensure that it operates correctly.

Carriage lock

The carriage lock is used when replacing the drill bit and mounting the drill motor. The lock consists of a knob that locks the carriage to the drill column.

Turn the knob to lock it.



• Feel by hand that the carriage is locked to the drill column.

General safety precautions



W ARNING! Read all safety warnings and all instructions. Neglecting to follow the warnings and instructions can lead to serious injury or death for the operator or others

Work area safety

- Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- People and animals can distract you causing you to lose control of the machine. For this
 reason, always remain concentrated and focused on the task.
- Do not use the machine in bad weather, such as dense fog, heavy rain, strong wind, intense cold, etc. Working in bad weather is tiring and can lead to dangerous conditions, e.g. slippery surfaces.
- Never start to work with the machine before the working area is clear and you have a firm foothold. Look out for any obstacles with unexpected movement. Ensure that no material can become loose and fall, causing injury when operating the machine.
- Always check the rear side of the surface where the drill bit will emerge when drilling right through. Secure and cordon off the area and make sure that no one can be injured or material damaged.

Personal safety



WARNING! There is always a risk of crush injuries when working with products containing moving parts. Always wear protective gloves.

- Wear personal protective equipment. See instructions under the "Personal protective equipment" heading.
- Never use the machine if you are tired, if you have drunk alcohol, or if you are taking medication that could affect your vision, your judgment or your co-ordination.
- Never allow anyone else to use the machine without first ensuring that they have understood the contents of the operator's manual.
- Be careful as clothing, long hair, and jewellery can get caught in moving parts.
- · Never work alone, always ensure there is another person close at hand. Apart from being

able to receive help to assemble the machine, you can also get help if an accident should occur.

Use and care

- Never use a machine that is faulty. Carry out the checks, maintenance and service instructions described in this manual. Some maintenance and service measures must be carried out by trained and qualified specialists. See instructions under the Maintenance heading.
- Never use a machine that has been modified in any way from its original specification.
- Keep all parts in good working order and ensure that all fixtures are properly tightened.

Transport and storage

- Store the equipment in a lockable area so that it is out of reach of children and unauthorized persons.
- Store the drilling machine and stand in dry and frost free conditions.


General working stand safety warnings

W ARN IN G! Read all safety warnings and all instructions. Failure to follow the warnings and instructions may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

- Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or the battery pack from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories Accidental starting of the power tool is a cause of some accidents..
- Properly assemble the working stand before mounting the tool. Proper assembly is important to prevent risk of collapse.
- Securely fasten the power tool to the working stand before use. Power tool shifting on the working stand can cause loss of control.
- Place the working stand on a solid, flat and level surface. When the working stand can shift o rock, the power tool or work piece cannot be steadily and safely controlled.
- Do not overload the working stand or use as ladder scaffolding. Overloading or standing on the working stand causes the stand to be "top-heavly" and likely to tip over.

Fit the wheel set

• Fit the wheel set to the bracket on the rear of the baseplate and tighten the screws.



Secure the stand

There are three methods for fixing the stand.

- Securing with vacuum (DL-17 need a extra vacuum plate)
- Fixing with expander or anchor
- Fixing with threaded rod, washer and lock nut

Securing with vacuum plate



WARNING! The vacuum plate must never be used for ceiling or wall drilling. Careless or incorrect use can result in serious, even fatal injury.

If the vacuum plate is used, make sure the support surface is not porous and can loosen from the floor or the wall. Make sure that the vacuum pump has sufficient power to secure the vacuum plate.


Fixing with expander or anchor



IM PORTANT! When drilling roofs, only expander or anchor suitable for surfaces exposed to tensile forces should be used.

Use only expander or anchor which is approved for current application.

- For DL-17, Drill a hole for the expander/anchor at a distance of 280 mm (11") from the center of the hole.
- The distance from the center of the baseplate to the side of quick connection plate is:
 DL-25 253mm(9.96")
- Screw the baseplate tight. Check carefully that the expander is secured correctly.
- The bottom plate can be adjusted to the surface by using the leveling adjustment screws. Use the feed handle.



Fixing with threaded rod, washer and lock nut

If the mounting surface is inadequate for drilling in roofs or walls, the baseplate can be fixed using a threaded rod, which is mounted on the back end with a washer and locking nut.

Assembly of drill motor



 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{IMPORTANT!}}$ Always pull out the plug from the outlet socket before cleaning, maintenance or assembly.

- Always remove the drill bit before the motor is mounted or dismounted.
- Lock the feed housing lock.


Clamp assembly

- Put the clamp from the top of the carriage.
- Fasten the screw 1.
- Put the drill motor in the clamp, then fasten the screw 2 (2pcs).



Quick connection plate assembly

- Fasten the motor with screw 1 (4pcs).
- Put quick connection plate from the top of the carriage.
- Fasten the screw 2.



Adjust the column tilt

- Loosen the screw on carrying handle and the screw on baseplate (2 screws on DL-25).
- The angle indicator can be used for approximate adjustment. If higher precision is required, alternative measuring methods should be used.



Drilling in the ceiling



W ARNING! Use a water collector to avoid water penetrating into the machine. The machine must be covered with plastic or the like in order to prevent water penetrating into the machine, but do not cover the air intakes and air outlets.

MAINTENANCE

Stand maintenance



WARNING! Inspection and/or maintenance should be carried out with the motor switched off and the plug disconnected.

The lifetime of your machine can be extended considerably if it is used, cared for and maintained in the proper manner.

Cleaning and lubrication




IMPORTANT! Remove the drill motor.

- It is important that the drill stand is kept clean for functionality to be maintained.
- Clean the stand using a high pressure washer and then wipe dry.
- Lubricate the moving parts on the stand. Apply grease to counteract corrosion on the contact surfaces.

Adjusting the feed housing

If there is play between the column and the feed housing, the play must be adjusted.

• Use a wrench with SW32, adjust the screw 1 and screw 2 to feel the space between carriage and column.



MAINTENANCE

Repairs



IMPORTANT! All types of repairs may only be carried out by authorized repairmen. This is so that the operators are not exposed to great risks.

Daily maintenance

- 1 Check that nuts and screws are tight.
- 2 Clean the outside of the machine.
- 3 Check that the feed crank can be moved without resistance.
- 4 Check that the gearing moves easily and does not cause any noise.
- 5 Check for any wear or damage on the column.
- 6 Check that the feed housing can be moved easily and does not backlash against the stand column.
